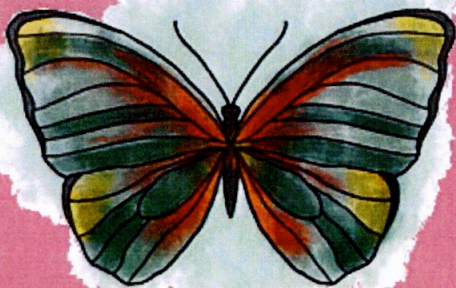

As many of you know, I enjoy the daily devotion from the Center for Action and Contemplation. Sometimes the devotion can be very academic, but during the week following Easter the topic was on Resurrection Faith. On Friday April 5th, Father Richard Rohr posted an excerpt from his homily on April 5, 2015 called "What is Resurrection? A New Story Line" that really resonated with me. The title of the daily devotion is "Resurrection through Connection" and since my topic recently was

what a resurrection life looks like, I thought I would share. Father Richard describes how it's possible to experience resurrection before we die. He writes:

"We don't need to wait for death to experience resurrection. We can begin resurrection today by living connected to God. Resurrection happens every time we love someone even though they were not very loving to us. At that moment we have been brought to new life. Every time we decide to trust and begin again, even after repeated failures, at that moment we've been resurrected. Every time we refuse to become negative, cynical, hopeless, we have experienced the Risen Christ. We don't have to wait for it later. Resurrection is always possible *now*.

The resurrection is not Jesus' private miracle; it's the new shape of reality. It's the new shape of the world. It's filled with grace. It's filled with possibility. It's filled with newness.

The resurrection is not a miracle story to prove the divinity of Christ, something that makes him the winner. It's a storyline that allows us all to be winners. ALL! No exceptions! There's no eternal death for anybody: *ALL are invited to draw upon this infinite Source, this infinite Mystery, this infinite Love, this infinite Possibility. Spiritually speaking, we live in a world of abundance, of infinity. But most of us walk around as if it were not true, operating in a world of scarcity where there's never enough. There's not enough for me, there's not enough for you, there's not enough for everybody.*

And so we hoard it—Spirit, Love, Life—to ourselves. We hoard grace, we hoard mercy. We don't allow ourselves to be conduits through which it pours into the world. Truly, the only way we can hold onto grace, mercy, love, joy—any spiritual gift—is to give them away consciously and intentionally. Once we stop acting as a conduit, we lose them ourselves. That's why there are so many sad, bitter, and angry people. Disconnected from God, we choose death. We ourselves contribute to negativity, cynicism, anger, and even to the oppression of other races and religions. In that state, it's always *other people who are wrong*.

In a homily from the second century of the church offered on Holy Saturday, this is what we hear Jesus say:

'I am your God, who for your sake have become your son. Out of love for you and for your descendants I now by my own authority command all who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are in darkness to be enlightened, all who are sleeping to arise. I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell [*usually a hell of our own making —RR*]. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of my hands, you who were created in my image. Rise, let us leave this place, for you are in me and I am in you; together we form only one person and we cannot be separated. [1]"

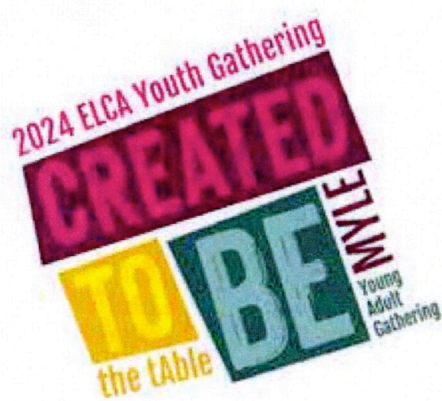

We have been created to be ourselves! Created by the Holy One. Since the last time the ELCA came together for an ELCA Youth Gathering, our young people have experienced several major life events. Still today, we are experiencing an ongoing public health crisis mixed with an economic and political crisis. However, we can rest assured that we are created to be in relationship with one another.

Each day we are present has a different idea.

*We are created to be brave, to show up with an open mind and heart, willing to be challenged.

*We are created to be authentic, to bring our whole selves and know that we are loved by our Creator.

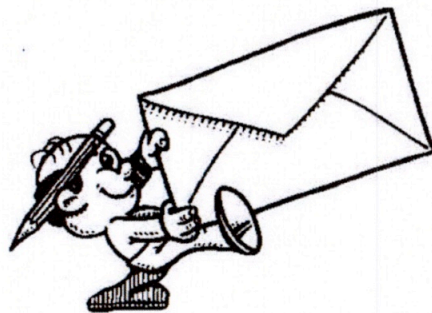
*We are created to be free, to be transformed by the gospel.

*We are created to be disruptive, to work for justice for all our siblings.

*We are created to be disciples, to be sent out into the world to love our neighbor just as we are loved by God.

New Orleans has always been its true authentic self. The theme, "Created to Be," highlights the arts, music, and soul of this beautiful, vibrant and resilient city. It is a city that was built to host and be a city where all of God's children come together. While at the Gathering, we plan to dive deeper into justice, mental health and anti-racism conversations. These are hard conversations, but churches desperately need to have these conversations. There is a hope to foster relationships and be sanctuary for each other. Martin Luther highlighted that we are saint and sinner simultaneously, and we need forgiveness when we aren't or can't be brave, authentic, free, disruptive disciples. Each month, we will share some of the materials we will be using to get ready to head to New Orleans. We hope to encourage open and frank conversations before and after our journey!!

For those who may not know what it is, in the Narthex, there is a display with a bunch of envelopes on them numbered 1-100 (some have already been taken). When an envelope is picked, the number on the front is the amount of money to give. The money raised will not only help us get to New Orleans, but also provide retreats and activities throughout the year. **



Worship & Music News:

Were you aware that our ELW Hymnal has TEN different liturgical settings of music for worship? With One Voice Hymnal has 3 settings and the new All Creation Sings (ACS for short) has 2 more. Many of us have grown used to the same settings during worship...because it is familiar.

Your Worship & Music Committee would like to explore some of the less utilized worship music over the next several months. Beginning on Easter Sunday, March 31, through Pentecost Sunday, May 19, we will be using Setting 10 (found on pages 203-209) as the basis for our liturgical music. All of the pieces...the Kyrie, Canticle of Praise, Gospel Acclamation, Holy, Holy, Holy, and Lamb of God...are set to the music of many popular hymns. For example, the Canticle of Praise (Glory be to God) on page 204, is set to the hymn "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore You."

Then, beginning on May 26, we will change to Setting 8 (found on pages 184-192) until August 11. Setting 8 is a more contemporary style of music that can have us all leaving with a little pep in our step to start our week! Once we enter into the program year on August 18, we will return to the familiar Setting 3 we were using prior to the Lent Season.

The Worship & Music Committee would like your feedback as we explore the different styles of music for worship. If something speaks to your heart in worship, we want to know. If we try something that is a distraction to your worship experience, we want to know. We want to try to find a happy balance so music enhances your time in worship in community and with God.

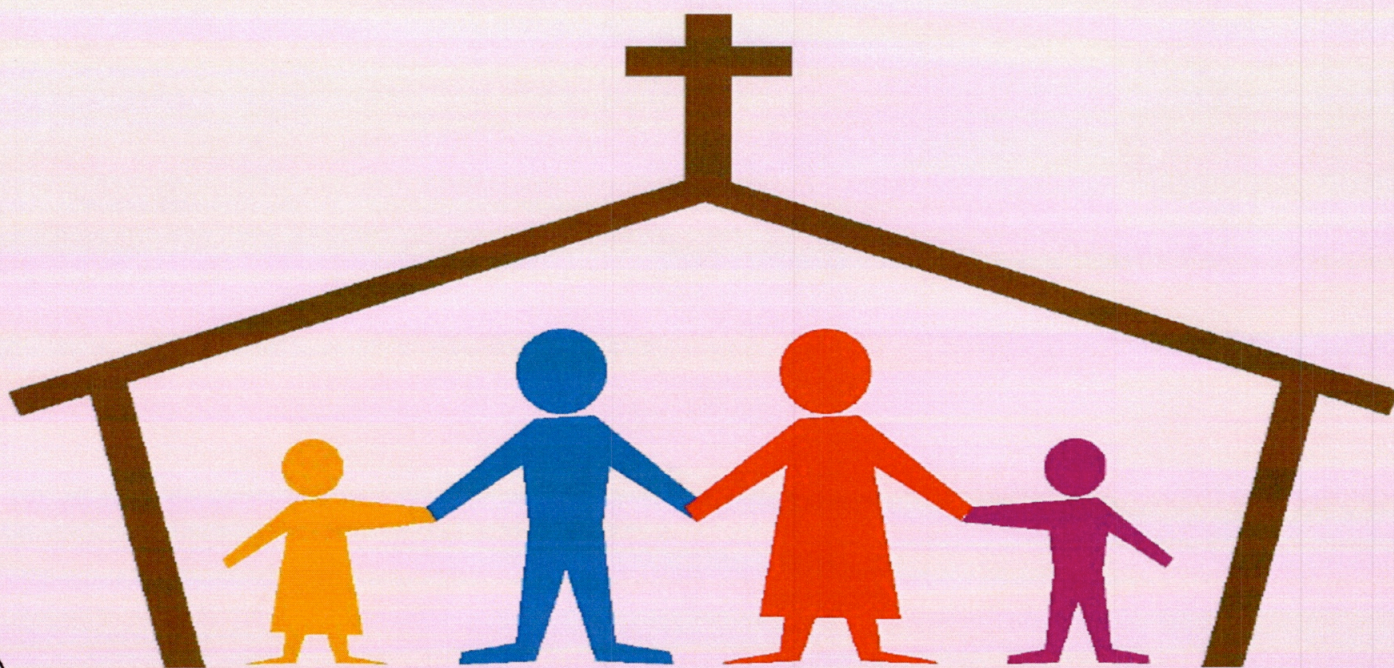

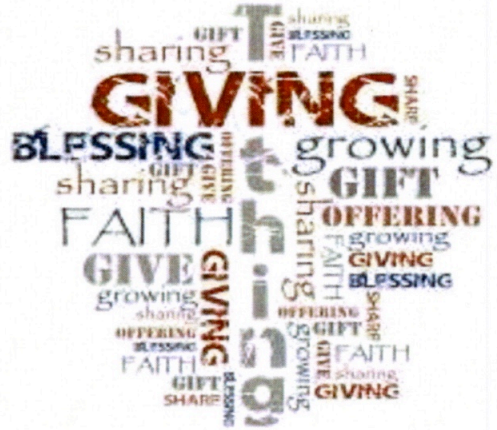
